PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1975

BELNAP FAMILY BOOK

"Heritage With Honor" has been completed and distributed to all who have placed orders. We appreciate the many comments and compliments received. It was the work of many, completed by the many for the many.

We are particularly pleased that it is fulfilling its purpose in bringing our past heritage to the knowledge of present generations. We are thrilled to hear your comments on how it is being used as a teaching tool at family gatherings.

We have sold half of the 700 copies but must sell 300 more to amortize the loan and meet printing costs. The debt hangs heavy over me personally, especially with interest rates high. The original publishing cost was \$22,500.00. The remaining balance is \$8,000.00. We are grateful to several in the family for large contributions and loans that have made this possible.

Every descendent family of Gilbert Belnap should have a copy of this book in their home.

BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

Each of us have been commanded to have a personal and family Book of Remembrance in our home. The Belnap book, "Heritage With Honor," fulfills that commitment as a supplement to your own personal book of remembrance. Your own personal records should contain at least four generations of your ancestry. Every living descendent of Gilbert Belnap can trace his genealogy immediately beyond his first four generations through this book.

I have recently participated in the Annual Priesthood Genealogy Seminar of the Church. Emphasis was made by the leadership to a concept which I had introduced there concerning the ties between generations. I hold to the concept that in order to preserve the links between generations, young people need more than anything to identify with a multi-generational family whose roots are grounded in fundamentals and absolutes.

Modern society is torn apart not only by geography but by standards and modes of life. Youth need to find their eternal identity and require an anchor in a day in which they are tossed to and fro with every wind of fashion or doctrine.

A COMMANDMENT REAFFIRMED

The leadership of the Church has restated in the above-mentioned Seminar, "one of the basic principles of Priesthood Genealogy is that every member of the Church should compile a Book of Remembrance. Couples should, upon marriage, combine their Books of Remembrance to form

the nucleus for a family book of remembrance.

I feel that parents in our Belnap family should make available one of our books, "Heritage With Honor," to each of the children before or at the time of marriage, as an extension of their personal book of remembrance.

PATTERN OF BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

A book of remembrance has long been taught to include (1) Pedigree Charts, (2) group record forms for direct line ancestors, and (3) personal record forms.

To be the tool that the Lord intended, however, it must be more than these. It should contain vital living documents of each person through the story of his life's journey. This has been a commandment from the beginning of time. We read in Moses 6:4-6 that Adam and his descendants kept a Book of Remembrance from generation to generation under the "spirit of inspiration," that their children might be taught true values. The book recorded their faith and works, their righteousness and devotion and their adherence to the revealed plan of salvation.

Our Book of Remembrance is a witness to the Lord that our family is bound and sealed by the generations and is "remembered before the Lord," and when it is "worthy of all acceptation" is recorded in heaven as we document it here on earth.

Similar records have been kept by the Saints in all ages (Mal. 3:16-17; 3 Nephi 24:15-16). The Church keeps similar records today and commands its members to keep their own personal family histories and testimonies (D&C 85).

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF BOOKS OF REMEMBRANCE

1. They should be prepared with the guidance of the Holy Spirit.
2. They should contain those things which will unify, strengthen uplift and exalt.
3. They should be used along with the standard works to instruct our families in the ways of the Lord.
4. They keep alive a vivid memory of our ancestors and help achieve that love of our patriarchal order which seals and binds us together eternally.

The Sacred History portion of the book of remembrance should include:

1. The spiritual history of each individual (1 Nephi 6:3-5; Abr. 1: 28, 31).
2. The father's blessing to each of his children as well as the blessing given by a Church Patriarch.
3. Testimonies as inspired by the Holy Ghost.
4. Faith promoting experiences.

5. Priesthood lineage and line of Priesthood authority.
6. Inspired writings and spiritual discussions.

It has not been customary with most of us in this dispensation to compile our spiritual history. That has been reaffirmed in our day as a commandment. Also, modern social and psychological needs of our posterity necessitate it.

Let us gather in our scattered letters, diaries, journals, family histories and traditions. Living parents and grandparents should be contacted using oral history techniques when possible.

As records become perfect, they become celestial records. Children who get involved retain the Spirit of Elijah with them for life.

FAMILY ORGANIZATION IN THE CHURCH TODAY

We have had a formal Belnap organization for many years. We are incorporated as a non-profit organization with the State of Utah and with the Internal Revenue Service. We have a set of Articles and By-Laws and our business conforms to their standards. Contributions to our organization and its publications are tax deductible.

The Church has now asked us to begin to pattern and build our family organizations upon the patriarchal order, which is: (1) The patriarchal order in the family is a celestial law; (2) each priesthood-led family is a kingdom or government within itself.

Adam instituted the patriarchal order among his children and this institution originated in heaven. It came down through a lineage of birthright.

Our family has been organized in the past from the top down and rightfully so. Gilbert Belnap is our patriarch in this dispensation. But his posterity now numbers in the thousands. The strength of patriarchal relationship must come as it does in the Church, from the bottom up or from the individual family unit. For example, (1) Single families within the larger family should organize first; (2) the right of the firstborn son, if worthy, to preside over his father's family in family organizational matters when the father is deceased, should be the ruling principle in organizing multi-unit or multi-generational families in the Church.

PRIESTHOOD COMMITMENTS OF MISSIONARY, HOME TEACHING, WELFARE AND GENEALOGICAL ACTIVITY

The single family organization should begin to implement the programs of the Priesthood within its structure.

1. Missionary activity should consist of preparation of the preparation of the children to serve missions, the formation of mission savings funds, and assisting through member referral and fellowshipping local missionary projects.
2. Home teaching is aided by drawing on histories and faith promoting stories of ancestors. Family get-to-gethers and reunions are merely "family home evenings," on a larger scale.
3. Welfare activity would consist mainly of guaranteeing adequate education and employment opportunity for each member. A home storage program is important.
4. Genealogical activity would begin with training children to appreciate family ties and heritage through developing a personal and family Book of Remembrance. Experience in the temple for both young and old is imperative.

The grandparent level of organizations provide living family members a unique opportunity for choice family experiences. Through its associations, the child begins to grasp the timelessness of the family unit.

1. Missionary activity should guarantee each member the privilege of serving on a full-time mission. Activity of each member should be of prime concern.
2. Get-to-gethers ought to be as frequent as possible within geographical limits and at least an annual visit.
3. Welfare is sharing and consecrating spiritual, educational, cultural and temporal blessings.
4. Genealogical concern should be directed at all other family lines than those of the Gilbert Adeline and Henrietta Belnap antecedents.

We strongly urge a formal organization of each of the 15 descendent families of Gilbert Belnap. Many are so organized. The others should follow suit.

Enclosed in this packet is a set of Articles of Incorporation for the State in which you organize. In most cases this would be Utah or Idaho.

This next year, the Board of Directors made up of representatives of each of the 15 descendent families will follow through with a more patriarchally oriented pattern of organization for their own units as well as for the main Gilbert Belnap organization. They are encouraged to publish their own family volumes. Greater emphasis on this direction will be given at Stake Conferences in 1976.

All genealogical research and temple work for the antecedents of Gilbert Adeline and Henrietta will continue to be coordinated through the Gilbert Belnap Family Organization. We will continue to meet every other year and emphasize regional reunions to offer wider participation.

RESEARCH RESULTS

Research is progressing on the "grandmother" lines in England. The lines of the wives of our main-line English Belnaps are producing great results. We should have the English work largely completed in another two years.
