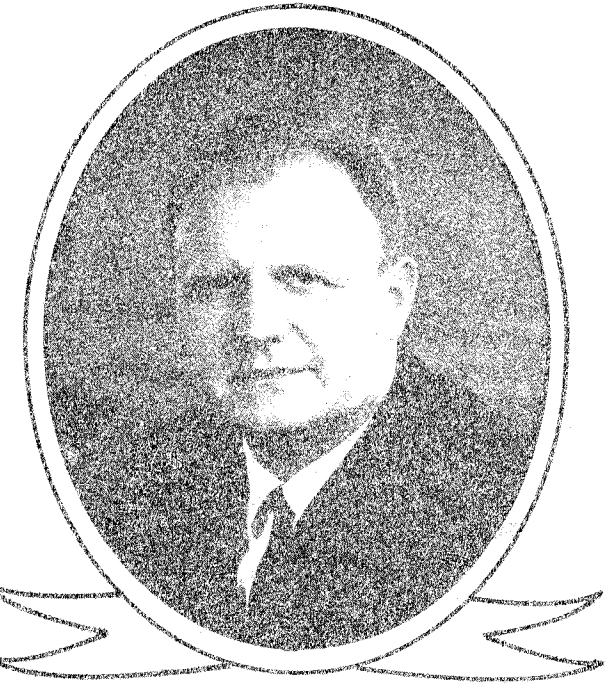

## EDITORIAL

### Good-Hearted People Aid Flood Area

"Residents of the Upper Snake River Valley, devastated four weeks ago when the Teton Dam broke, are reported in high spirits these days because their faith in their fellows has been restored, .....The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints has made help for flood ravaged Snake River Valley a special assignment for its members since the stricken area has a large percentage of Mormons. (NOTE: a large number of Belnap Family Members are in this area.)

Last week, for example, the five stakes in one Ogden region were each asked to provide 60 people a day -- that's a total of 300 -- to help "muck out" the homes.

.....More than 4,000 volunteers have daily been on the scene. All working not for pay but because their friends are in trouble.

One Ogdenite, returning from Rexburg, reported that "I was surprised at one thing in particular."

"After what they went through," he added, "those people have every reason to be depressed. Instead, they're in high spirits. Their morale has been boosted by finding out that others really care."

.....The big thing is, as the Ogdenite said, finding that others "care."

What a symbol for the Bicentennial. It's this spirit that has made America great."

## THE BOY WHO HELPED TO STOP THE BRITISH

Jesse Belnap - 1760-1854

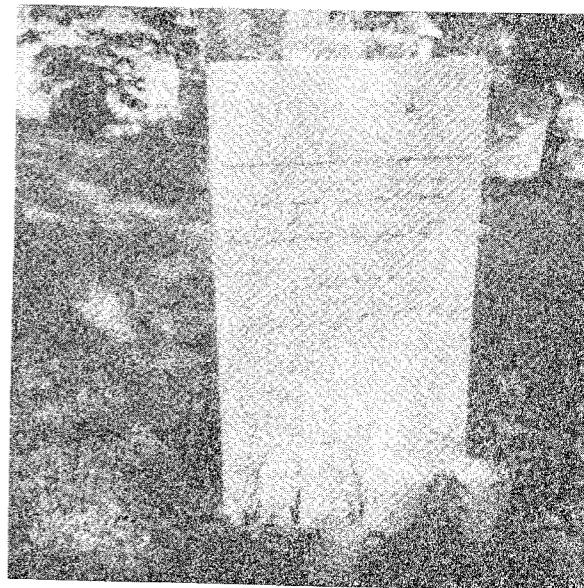
Jesse Belnap was born in Connecticut and was only a lad of fifteen when the Revolutionary War began, and he begged his mother to let him go to fight for his country. However, his mother would not let him go until he was seventeen years old. He joined the army at Hebron, Connecticut in 1777.

All the men in his company were artificers. Artificers were men who built bridges and roads and machinery and made it possible for the regular soldiers to move about. They are called "engineers" and "seabees" now.

One day Captain Horton was told that the British intended to sail their ships up the Hudson River, and the General told him to make a chain to stretch across the river to stop the ships, so Captain Horton put his men to work to make the big chain.

Jesse knew how to do blacksmithing work and he worked hard with the other men until the long chain was completed. Then the Captain asked for volunteers to swim across the river. Jesse stepped forward and said, "I will go, Captain." So Jesse swam across and pulled a string with him. When he reached the other bank he used the string to pull a rope across, and then the other soldiers swam across, holding on to the rope. Then they tied one end of the rope to the heavy chain and pulled and pulled until the chain was stretched across the river. They fastened the chain to a tree on each side of the river and stood guard with their guns to keep the enemy from unfastening it. In this way the British ships were kept from sailing up the Hudson River, for no ship could sail over the chain.

This boy grew up and married Eunice Hall, and they each lived to be over ninety years old and had 17 children. Jesse was the grandfather of Gilbert Belnap.

## WAR DEPARTMENT.

### Revolutionary Claim.

I certify that in conformity with the Law of the United States, of the 7th June, 1832, Jesse Belnap  
of the State \_\_\_\_\_ of Pennsylvania \_\_\_\_\_  
who was an Artificer in the Army of the  
Revolution \_\_\_\_\_

is entitled to receive One Hundred & forty four dollars and  
\_\_\_\_\_ cents per annum, during his natural life, commencing  
on the 4th of March, 1831, and payable semi-annually, on the  
4th of March, and 4th of September, in every year.

Given at the War Office of the United States,  
this 28<sup>th</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ day of January  
one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two

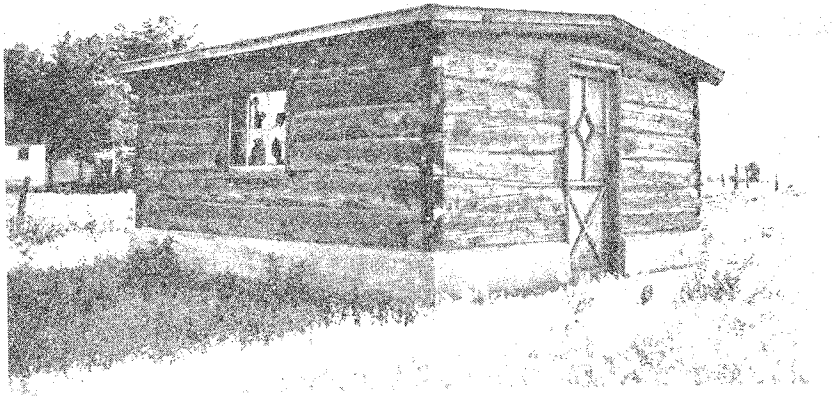

GILBERT R. BELNAP HOME IN HOOPER, UTAH

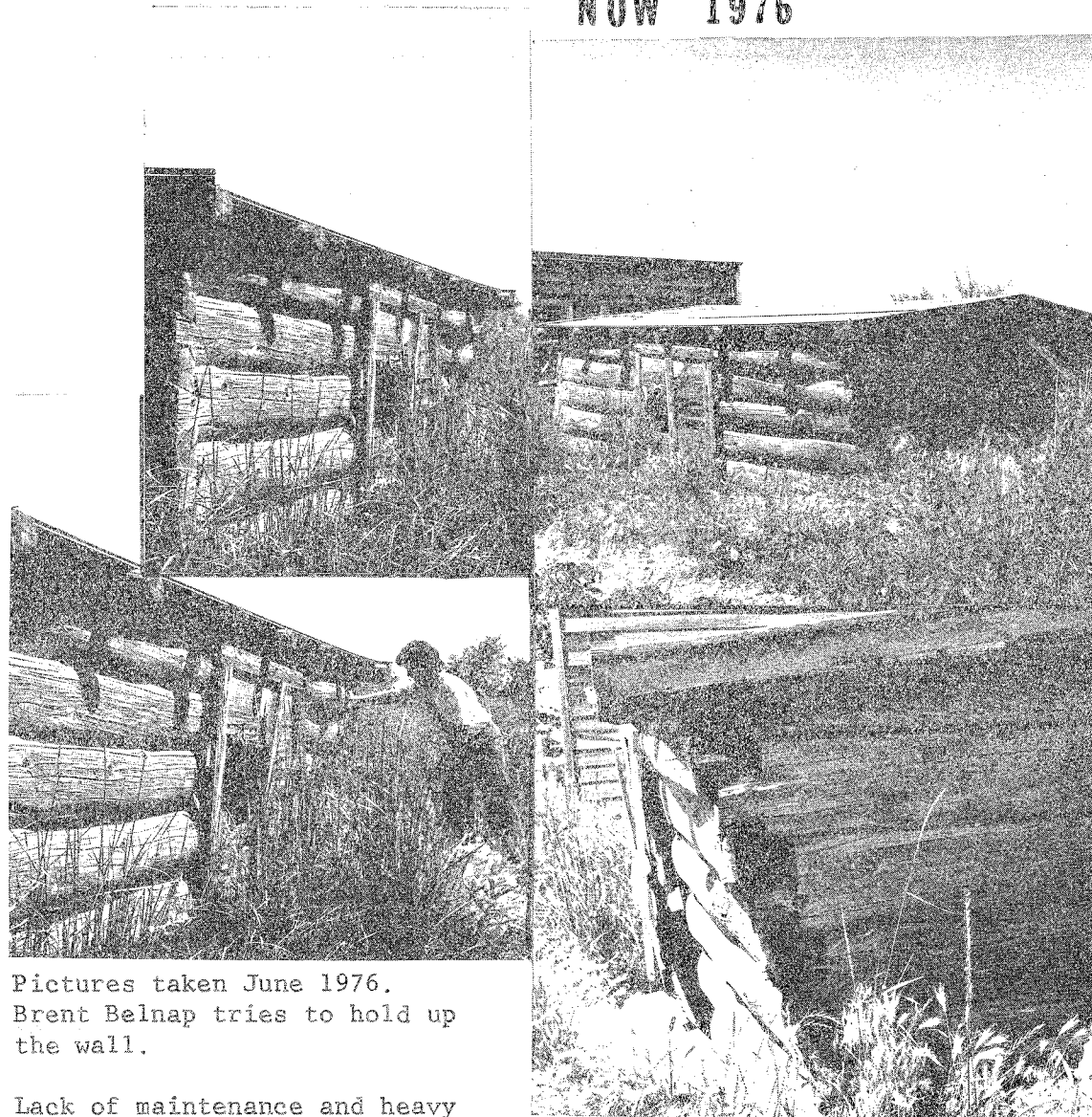

# Stories From the Past

## MORRISITE WAR IN WEBER COUNTY

When Apostles Wilford Woodruff and John Taylor visited a small settlement of Mormon pioneers at the mouth of Weber Canyon in 1861, it must have been with a deep sense of foreboding.

They had been assigned a special task by Brigham Young: they were to investigate an uneducated Welsh convert named John Morris and then report their findings to Salt Lake City.

Morris claimed to have received a revelation in which God instructed him: "I have chosen thee to be a mighty man and thou shalt prophesy to many nations and peoples and kings and tongues. I say unto thee that the mountains shall tremble at the uttering of thy voice."

September 1, 1859 he had fired a letter off to Brigham Young and informed the leader of the Saints that since it had been revealed that he (Morris) was "the seventh angel spoken of in the Revelation of St. John," the church hierarchy should consider making room for his talents as soon as possible.

After Brigham Young ignored his requests to "come to the head of the church," Morris deluged Salt Lake City with letters claiming Brigham Young's "failures" and proposing massive reforms for the church.

Even though he failed to impress church leaders in Salt Lake City, he had quite an affect on his community and managed to convince over a hundred of his neighbors that he was the new prophet. When the bishop of the community, Richard Cook, declared himself a believer of the Morrisite doctrine, Brigham Young began to take this Welshman seriously for the first time.

Morris had previously been excommunicated for immorality. At the present time he was living with a married woman.

Apostles Taylor and Woodruff conducted a public hearing February 11, 1861. Bishop Richard Cook was required to state his position with reference to Morris. He boldly announced his belief in Morris and stated Brigham Young to be a failure as President of the Church. Others made the same statement. After the investigations, Cook, Morris and 15 others were excommunicated.

On April 6, 1861, Morris and his followers effected an organization. Morris became the head of the new church, with Richard Cook and John Banks as counselors. They established a communal pattern of living. They believed in the immediate coming of Christ and all their needs would be supplied without labor. They neglected the ordinary pursuits of life and gave themselves to holding meetings.

Morris received a blizzard of revelations. It is said to have amounted to six volumes, each containing 200 to 300 pages. This sect rapidly increased until the community numbered about 600. They called their location "Kingdom Fort." Later it became "Morris Fort."

An argument broke out between the leaders of the new movement about whether or not dissident members who decided that enough was enough had the right to leave the commune with their complete original chattel.

Salt Lake Chief Justice Kinney received four affidavits charging that Morris was holding four prisoners in his stronghold at Kingdom Fort. It seems these were four disenchanting followers who wished to leave and insisted on liberating some of their original property.

Writs were issued for Morris' arrest by Judge Kinney, but the marshall reported back that Morris had ignored the writs and was protected by "at least one hundred strong men."

That incident keyed one of the darkest chapters in the history of Weber County: the Morrisite War.

In June 1862 Deputy Richard T. Burton was sent from Salt Lake City with a posse to serve the writs and make arrests. Expecting trouble the posse consisted of 150 men of the Salt Lake County Militia and 150 from the Davis County Militia. The excitement of the occasion gathered many of the local residents to watch, including Gilbert R. Belnap, the young son of Gilbert Belnap.

The deputy set up camp not far from the mouth of Weber Canyon on the heights above Fort Kingdom. He served an ultimatum to the Morrisites that they had 30 minutes to surrender or they would be taken by

force. Morris retired to his room to receive more revelation. He received word that "his enemies will be destroyed and that none of the faithful would be injured." The revelation was read to the people, but was not discussed. Their 30 minutes had expired some time ago.

The militia opened fire and the first two cannon balls to strike the Fort killed two women and critically injured a young girl. As the locals began an advance on the Fort, the Morrisites opened fire and killed a militiaman.

The Fort was under seige for three days. Finally, a white flag was raised and Commander Burton entered the Fort to serve the writs.

Burton claimed to have fired 5,000 rounds of ammunition and one hundred cannon balls into the Fort during the three-day assault that had been witnessed by most of the local population.

"Are you ready to give up?" he asked Morris.

Morris is reported to have grabbed the reins of Burton's horse and cried out "All who are for me and my God, in life and in death, follow me!"

In the ensuing melee, Morris and his two counselors, Richard Cook and John Banks, were killed along with two more women. But the backbone of the insurrection was broken.

March 1863 at the trials, ninety-six Morrisites were indicted for resisting arrest and ten of those were charged with murder of a militiaman. Some sixty of the dissidents were tried, convicted and fined \$100, while seven of the ten charged with murder were found guilty of second degree murder and sentenced to long prison terms.

However, the new federal governor was intent on reducing the powers of Brigham Young, the church and local influence on the courts. Governor Stephen S. Harding pardoned all the Morrisites three days later without assigning any cause for his action.

Judge Kinney, who had issued the warrants for the arrest of the Morrisite leaders, issued a scathing rebuke of the act of the Governor in pardoning the prisoners. It was a shocked grand jury "when their most solemn and deliberated judgments can be thus ignored and set aside." They felt the Governor was "an officer dangerous to the peace and prosperity of the territory, etc."

After their pardon a few Morrisites left the territory. Some found employment among other Utah settlements.

General Patrick Edward Conner of Fort Douglas established a military post at Soda Springs in May 1863. He offered the Morrisites free transportation to found a settlement there. Two hundred people responded and some returned to their original church.

The only local war in the history of Weber County was over. It left many tales to be told by the young men who went to see a war.

When the cannon balls came in the direction of Gilbert R. Belnap that was not enough war for him. It is believed he took home to his father, Gilbert Belnap, a four pound rough hand-cast cannon ball. Others believe the cannon ball landed on the Belnap farm. This doesn't seem possible for that period of time, as the Belnap farm in Ogden would be too far away.

The cannon ball that Gilbert R. took home to his father is now in the possession of Della A. Belnap.
