2014 Belnap Family Reunion to be Held in Hooper

Hooper, of course, is the home of many Belnap Family Members from the time of its beginning in 1854 until the present time. Gilbert was the first Presiding Elder of Hooper Branch, Adaline its Relief Society President and Henrietta, one of the early school teacher. A BBQ lunch was provided by the family for those in attendance. There were approximately 220 members of the Belnap Family attending the event.

Ryan Shupe
A Fifth-Generation Violinist

The 2016 Belnap Family Reunion will be honored this year by Ryan Shupe, a fifth generation violist, singer, and leader of the *Ryan Shupe and the RubberBand*. He is also a direct descendant of Gilbert Belnap through his son Joseph. He is said to have a unique sound, the sound of Rock and Roll and Blue Grass.

Ryan, who is said to have played since his early youth, is a member of the LDS Church. When he was young, his father assembled a group of children, including a young Ryan Shupe. This group, called the Pee Wee Pickers continued together through his High School years, later playing with “bands throughout high school and college.”¹

In 1996 he formed the Rubber Band, now made up of Roger Archibald (guitar, vocals), Craig Miner (banjo, bouzouki, mandolin, guitar, vocals), Josh Larsen (bass guitar, string bass, vocals), and Nate Young (drums, vocals) and of course Ryan Shupe (fiddle, guitar, ukulele, mandolin, lead vocals “²

In 2005, after having recorded four albums on their own label, Ryan Shupe and the RubberBand, were signed to Capitol Records. “Their first album for Capitol, 2005's Dream Big, produced a Top 40 hit on the U.S. Billboard Hot Country Songs charts in its title track.”³ After signing with Montage Music in 2008 they extensively tour together, “promoted their unique brand of music

“The music is complex, but melodic enough for those who just want to hear the tune and tap their feet to the rhythm,” says Ryan Shupe: “If you’re a musician you like it, because it has complex arrangements and things that are different than what’s out there, because we’re pushing the boundaries a little bit, and doing a rock country hybrid with banjo and fiddle and stuff. But you’re still getting the songs that you’d like to hear played on the radio. I think we are able to be a great band live, yet also have solid songs people can relate to and enjoy. I want us to have songs that are great and mean something to people. We think it is the best sounding album we have to date.” (the band's official website).

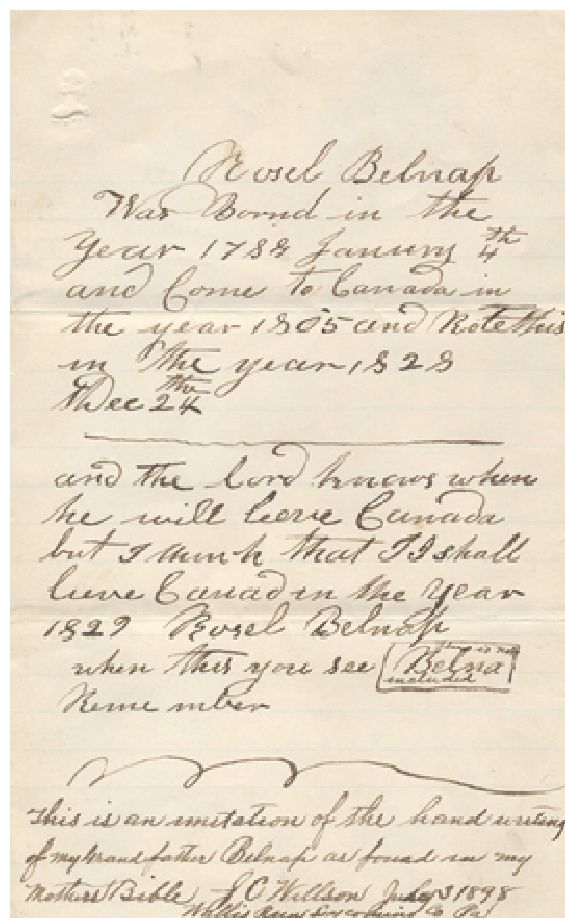


of the Seventy on April 2, 2011, at age 53. At the time of his call, he had been serving as a member of the Fifth Quorum of the Seventy in the Utah North Area. He received a bachelor of arts degree in business marketing from Weber State College in 1981 and an MBA from Utah State University in 1982. In 1982 he began his career with the Xerox Corporation and then in 1985 became a partner with The Boyer Company. Elder Cook has served in numerous Church callings, including full-time missionary in Hamburg, Germany, bishop, stake president's counselor, stake president, president of the New Zealand Auckland Mission, and Area Seventy. He recently completed an assignment as president of the Church's Africa Southeast Area. A third great grandson of Gilbert Belnap, Carl Bert Cook was born in Ogden, Utah, on October 15, 1957, to Bert Eugene and Ramona Poulson Cook. He married Lynette Hansen in December 1979. They are the parents of five children. Elder and Sister Cook reside in Liberty, Utah.

Rosel Belnap

Rosel Belnap, styled yeoman, was a man of some importance in his adopted country of Canada. At age 16 he left his native New York, likely taking a path through Kingston, Ontario, to settle in Northumberland County, Ontario.

He was the father of eight children in all, Gilbert Belnap being his 5th child born. Gilbert was a boy nearly eleven years old when his father died, and had rarely had the chance to visit him before this untimely death at age 34.

Rosel Belnap was the son of Jesse and Eunice (Hall) Belnap. He was born on January 4, 1788 in what was then Montgomery Co., New York.⁴ Rosel was the sixth child born to Eunice. His father Jesse had served in the Revolutionary War and following the end of hostilities moved from his native Connecticut to the wilderness of Montgomery Co., New York. It was here on 4 May 1789 that Jesse Belnap, Giles Gilbert, and Butler Gilbert, purchased Lot 22 (see map of Otego Patent below) in the Otego Patent from James LeRay.⁵ Today this land is located Susquehanna Valley near Canajoharie.

It is assumed that Montgomery County is the location where Rosel Belnap and other siblings were born.

The land of Otego Patent consisted of 69,000 acres of dense wooded forest. There were no common schools for educating the children until 1795 and even then they were sparse. No school in the patent was recorded until the early 1800's, leaving the education of the children in the hands of the parents. Even churches were few.

The remote area in which Rosel would have spent his earliest days provided little in privations incidental to



settlement. Shelter was provided only with hard work. Few conveniences existed. Each family manufactured their own cloth, carded their own wool and did the sewing necessary for clothes. As Rosel grew his responsibilities grew. He had four older brothers would also help the family

doing the planting and farming necessary to provided subsistence in the wilderness. In 1801 Jesse's friend Giles Gilbert died, and the following year his wife Deborah (Hall) Gilbert passed away. This void of a friend and joint owner of the property, put Jesse's land holding in jeopardy. In the summer of 1803 the land was repossessed and sold at auction.

In 1790 Jesse continued to reside in Montgomery County, as did his living children, but had moved on to Milton, Saratoga County by 1800. In 1805, Rosel had said his good byes and headed for the Canadian wilderness.

The *Constitutional Act of 1791* created the Province of Upper Canada (Ontario), which was divided into districts. The district of Newcastle, which was originally part of Durham and Northumberland Counties and Emily sat within their boundaries.

Later records confirm that he was a man of land ownership, a yeoman, but many obstacles laid in his way to make a success out of his life; hard work and determination, as he had already been accustomed too was required. He had success as a farmer, a land owner, which brought needed money to the

family. Everything you would have thought would make the family happy. But his happiness in Canada may have waned. In 1828 he remarked that he "would leave Canada in 1829," but failed to do so. It was possibly the birth of Thomas Derlin Belnap, his last child, that prompted him to remain.

It may have been some legal challenges that disheartened Rosel in the following years. On 31 December 1822 Rosel was at his residence in Hope when he was visited by Abraham Hagerman. Hagerman spoke to Rosel wishing to collect a note that Rosel possessed against Mr. Hagerman. After some ill words that were spoken, Rosel told Mr. Hagerman to leave his house. As Hagerman was leaving Rosel kicked at him and in the process fell down. Immediately Rosel came to his feet and grabbed Hagerman's axe, which he evidently was carry with him for protection. An implied threat seemed to be warranted from Hagerman carrying the axe into Rosel's house. Rosel was instructed by another man to put down the axe, a request that he confirmed, but grabbed his gun and "swore he would be the death of him (Hagerman)." The following day, Hagerman filed a complaint against Rosel and following the trial, Rosel was found guilty of assault and fined 10 shillings and two weeks of confinement. A second incident took place on 13 July 1824 and *Indictment for Assault* was again filed against Rosel Belnap and his friend James Caldwell. Rosel and Caldwell were charged with assaulting Henry Elliott on 23rd April 1824. He again pleaded

not guilty, but later changed his plea and both were fined a small sum.

It is not known what sparked his leaving his family in New York at age 17 and immigrating to Canada, then a heavily wooded wilderness. But there was plenty of land for the taking and plenty of land for those willing to work. It is likely an enticing prospect for a young anxious boy. It is more than likely that he initially settled in Durham County, as later census records locate him there. There is no particular finding of land ownership in Hamilton, but examination of assessments and census records of Hamilton showed Rosel and his family living there from 1812 until 1821, with an absence during the 1813, and no land assessment in 1814. Some family tradition of him taking part in the War of 1812, but no records had substantiated this. In fact, documents show many of the American immigrants would set idle during Canada's need to muster soldiers against the United States. A search of Canadian muster and troop rolls for Hamilton and surrounding township are void of the Belnap name. There is however, one reference to Roswell Belnap of having an unclaimed letter for 1813 in Hartford, Connecticut. Did he migrate back to the United States during the War, or simply a misdirected letter? These questions remain unanswered at the writing of this history.

Rosel met and married Jane Richmond about 1806. Jane was the daughter of Sylvester and Jane (Bowerman) Richmond. Sylvester had settled in Crame Township, Northumberland County, Ontario as early as 1797, taking a Land Grant there on 17 June

1797. Of his children, which were numerous, many lived near and around Crame, Hamilton and Haldimand Townships, so the familiarity with the Richmond family took early stage to Rosel's residency there.

After their marriage, his first child was born on 5 January 1807 in Durham. He was named for Rosel's father Jesse. The second child Louisa, was born about 1808, it is said in Whitby, New Castle District.

In 1812 Rosel's name appears in the census of Hamilton Township, with a listing for a two-person household. At the time he had 100 acres of uncultivated land, likely that of a lease. In 1814 he again appears on the Hamilton rolls of assessment with no land listed in his name. By 1815 a census lists a family of four, one boy and one girl under age 16. Yearly census records were shown to include Rosel, and his brother Ansel in close proximity, both with growing families. He appears on the census for Hope Township in 1822, although in 1821, at the time of the census, he appeared in Hamilton. Likely the census was taken during the summer months, when travel by tax collectors was easier and unappeased.

On 22 December 1821 Gilbert was born in Hope Township the following year Rosel's name appears on Hope Township Census Rolls.

That same year, on 3 April 1822, Rosel petitions for a *Crown Land Grant* in in the Northwest corner of Emily Township, Lot 1 in the 4th Concession. Papers indicate that Rosel had already

taken the *Oath of Allegiance*⁶ for Canada and was regarded as of “good character.” Emily Township was covered by forests at the time, and the axe was needed in order to clear the land and make use of the soil. Whether this land was ever granted in unknown, but we do know from the history of his son, that he resided in Hope Township during the year 1822 and through 1828 when the births of three more child took place. It is also quite possible that the leased land holdings existed in addition, and that he farmed these lands as he did his home lot.

In the year 1831 Rosel petitioned for a lease of land in Clarke Township, near Orono, where in the years following the death of Rosel and Jane Belnap their son Jesse lived. Rosel paid the fee for this land on 13 March 1831.

On 13 January 1832 Gilbert Belnap was apprentice to William C. Moore, a wagon maker and wheelwright, for whom his father made an agreement with. The agreement, allowed for the training of the young Gilbert, as well as the proper care and schooling that was common for the day. Moore though, did not keep his side of the bargain, being abusive to the young boy, but not so while Rosel was alive.

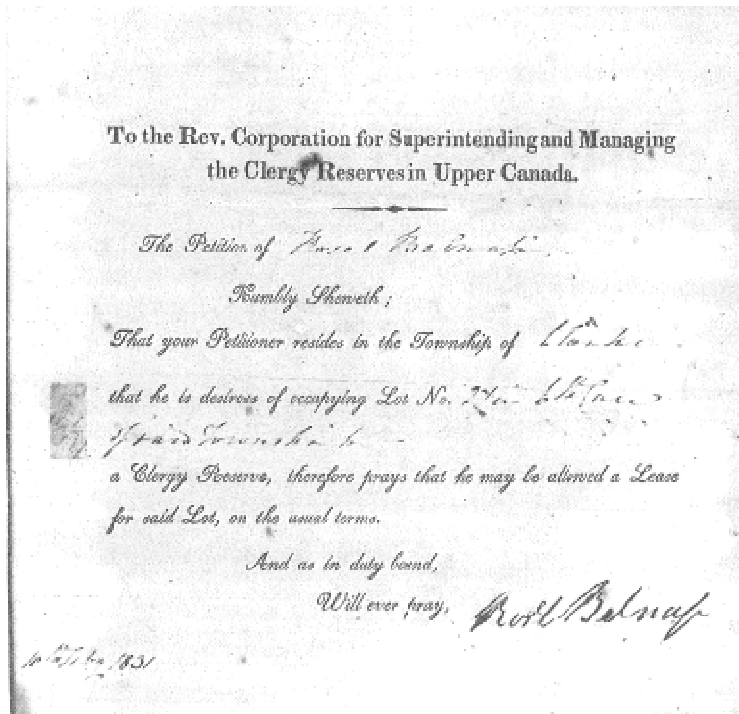
Rosel's had at least two run ins with the legal system in Hope tough nature,

Rosel was a well-known land owner in Upper Canada, having gone there in the early days of settlement, when the area was wild. No doubt this added to the temperament of Rosel, which Gilbert would

have seen as a young boy and which would have stuck with him during the mistreatment and later. Rosel and his wife Jane lived but a short life, but propagated a large family and today descendants number in the tens of thousands. William was a man who learned to despise and in later years met with some violence, but violence was not new to the Belnap family.

Past times in the remote areas were essential for entertainment. Horse racing was one such activity and had begun on Toronto Island as early as 1797. Only the wealthy land owners would have horses dedicated just for this purpose. Rosel could have well fell into this category. Excitement, and gambling were strong motivators for racing and Rosel was thought to have horses used for this purpose. Although most of the horses used in racing were mere farm horses, with bragging rights being the prize to the winner, it is not known Rosel's racing ability only that a tragedy occurred on 2 December 1832, causing the accidental death of Rosel, followed on 3 March 1833 with the death of his wife Jane Richmond Belnap. They left five orphaned, the oldest 26 years old and ill equipped to handle the financial responsibilities and the needs of the children.

Marshall B. Stone

Gilbert Belnap was born in Hope Twp., New Castle District, Ontario, on December 22 1821, the third son of Rosel and Jane Richmond Belnap. On 13 January 1832 Gilbert was apprenticed to a violent man named William C. Moore, a year later he was orphaned and taken from his native country. His early life following his parent's death he was met with many obstacles to overcome. He overcame many of those obstacles with the help family members and with the kindness of others.

One act of kindness bestowed on Gilbert and his youngest brother Thomas was expressed by Marshall B. Stone. Gilbert writes; "Considering myself at that time of an age sufficient to take care of myself I told him to bestow his hospitality on those that were more dependent and accordingly struck out in the world for myself." Accompanied by his younger brother and "being determined to take my own course and maintain an independent course," he left the security of his neighbors. Gilbert's journey was "very slow" and by the third day had only reached 30 miles distant. At this place Gilbert and Thomas were "obliged to stop." "with an almost helpless child by my side and a mere stripling of a boy myself. I sought out the habitation of one Martial B. Stone, a preacher of the denominations of Christians of whom I had heard my father speak."⁷

“With him I remained for two years. For the small sum of five dollars per month of which I appropriated seven shillings and six pence per month of that currency for the board and education of my brother.⁸ “



Born in 1810 in Quebec, Canada, Marshall Benjamin Stone befriended Gilbert during his youth, which remained in Gilbert's memory.

Marshall emigrated to Canada about 1818 with his father and mother, Benjamin and Emily Stone, who had left Canada and resettled in Massachusetts. When they returned to Canada, they settled on Concession 2 near Whitby, and operated a school on their property. In Whitby Marshall attended the local schools and had at least an elementary education⁹

Marshall B. Stone was an early minister for the *Connection for the Disciples*,¹⁰ an Oshawa church. By 1827 or 1828 the *Christian Connection* congregation began meeting in the township of Whitby, not far from the Belnap home. Stone lived in or near Oshawa and in 1834 he sent a report to Alexander Campbell's *Millennial*

Harbinger,¹¹ in which he told about “a little band of reformers” (Disciples) who had begun meeting in Toronto.

Marshall married an Oshawa neighbor, Emily Blair, around 1831, and the couple had at least nine children before Emily died in 1847. About a year later Marshall married Mary Wallrant, and they had two children.¹² By the 1840's, Stone was preaching around Oshawa and Bowmanville leaving for several weeks at a time. He journeyed to Prince Edward County where he preached the gospel of Christ in 1848 and made a move to Minnesota in 1854. It was a somber day when Marshall left his home. “The writer can recall with pleasing memory the many happy hours he has spent in literary associations and other occasions in which Mr. Stone delighted to serve the young people. It was a loss to the young people of Oshawa when Mr. Stone left the village.”¹³

Marshall and Mary moved to Minnesota, a remote territory at the time, settling near St. Peters. Here the respected citizen would become the first Justice of the Peace and became active in the temperance movement. In 1856 he was living on section 35 near the town of Renville. He served as Provost Marshal during the Sioux War of 1862 among other positions of kind. When his wife Mary died in 1864 he married a third time, to Anna Johnston. In 1872 he was elected senator in the Minnesota and the following year served on a Banking,

Corporation Committees as well as the Chair of the State Insane Asylum.¹⁴ His kindness to the mentally ill, the children and orphans never went unnoticed by the citizens of St. Peters.

He died in Minnesota in 30 July 1885 in St. Peter, Nicolett, Minnesota.

In a special tribute to our *Belnap Family Organization* historian Steven Belnap. After a long term illness Steven passed away on May 7, 2013.

STEVEN A. BELNAP



Steven “A” Belnap was the long time official historian of the Belnap Family Organization. Replacing his great aunt Della Belnap, Steven took over the duties of maintaining and cataloging Belnap family history information. He added to the ongoing collections, which his previous historian collected and had an outstanding knowledge of the descendants of the Belnap Family. I worked with Steven on many occasions in collecting collection of the Belnap history and often met with him, or corresponded with him for information pertinent to my goal. His face could always be seen at the Belnap Family Reunion, helping to set up, organize and man the booths at the reunions.

Steven was born December 12, 1956 in Oakland, California to former BFO President Gordon Belnap and our late secretary Joy McArthur. He grew up in Ogden and graduated from Ogden High School in 1975. He attended Weber State College and Utah State University and was affiliated with Sigma Gamma Chi fraternity.

He spent his entire life as a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints and served in an LDS Mission to the Florida Ft. Lauderdale (Spanish speaking) mission from 1976 to 1978, serving mostly in Puerto Rico. He worked for many years at Mortgage Computer in Ogden.

Steven had a keen interest in history and served as genealogist and historian for the Belnap Family Organization. He took pride in the updating and authenticating of the family’s genealogical records and enjoyed attending reunions and in the correspondence with relatives. He had a love for American History, in particular, the Civil War Period and also in the lives on the US Presidents. He traveled much of the US visiting historical sites. Steven had an exceptionally sharp mind with an uncanny ability to recall long forgotten dates and details. He always remembered to send birthday and holiday cards. Funny, kind and considerate, he loved telling jokes and stories, watching classic movies, reading and collecting books, playing board games and treating his nieces and nephews to special outings with “Uncle Teeb.”

Steven contracted osteomyelitis as an infant, which slightly affected his mobility. In 1998 he was involved in a

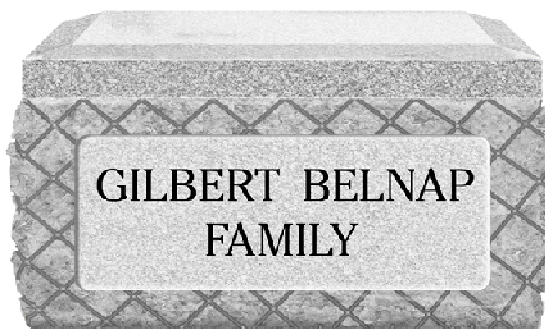
