## MEMBRANE 1.

June 16. *Inspecimus* of an indenture between the prior and convent of the  
Woodstock. church of Durham and Henry de Belton, late citizen of York, now  
deceased, witnessing that the prior and convent having regard to  
this that the rector of the church of All Saints in Overousegate, York,  
of their patronage, and the parishoners of the church have assented  
to the said Henry building some houses on a plot of land in the church  
yard of the said church containing in length on one side towards the  
street of Coppergate 52 feet and on the other side towards the street  
of Overousegate, 43 feet, and in breadth towards the chancel of the  
church 48 feet, and towards the rent of the commonalty 25 feet, for  
the sustenance of a chantry in honour of the Virgin Mary in the said  
church, and that William, archbishop of York, after inquisition taken,  
consented to the building of the houses, they granted to the said Henry  
a faculty to build the same, they to have power, if the chantry at any  
time cease, to distrain in the houses until it be revived, and Henry  
granted for him and his assigns to pay every Whitsuntide at York  
6 pounds of wax to the sacristan of Durham, if required, for light  
around the body of St. Cuthbert in the church of Durham; dated in  
the chapter of the said prior and convent of Durham, on the feast  
of St. Simon and St. Jude, 1336: and confirmation of the same, that  
the prior and convent, the heirs of Henry or the chaplain of the  
chantry be never disturbed at any time by reason of the premises or  
by reason of the grant and acquisition of the said place without the  
king's licence, or because the place is held in chief, as is said, or for  
any other cause contained in the writing aforesaid.
