these times committed divers depredations, robberies, oppressions, extortions, allegiances and illegal conventicles, as well as other trespasses and crimes, and although required on the king's behalf by the bailiffs and other ministers of the town to stand to the king's peace and reform their ways, and although the said bailiffs would have arrested them because they would not be brought to justice by them, resisted such arrest by force.
