July 7. Commission of oyer and terminer to Thomas Roos of Hamelak, Westminster. John de Nevill of Raby, Ralph, baron of Graystok, Thomas de Ingelby, Roger de Kirketon, Roger de Fulthorp, William Colvill of Ernecliff, 'chivaler,' Thomas Maulay and John de Dronsfield, in the county of Lincoln (*sic*), on complaint by Philip Darcy, 'chivaler,' that whereas he has returns and executions of the king's writs and distrains and attachments within his liberty of Wherleton, Eston, Grenhowe, Hoton, Semer, Boynton and Aldewerk, called 'Canterburyfee,' and no other should enter to make executions there, Alnethus de Hanlaby, 'chivaler,' John Coghel, Henry de Hayton, Henry Marchal of Acclom, Edmund Fauconer, 'Roberdesservant Coniers,' Robert Conyers 'le filz,' John, his brother, John Conyers of Hilton, John de Hilton, Robert de Hilton, Gilbert de Dalden, John Percy of Ormesby, John Kitson of Ormesby, Thomas Smythson of Stokton, John Osborn of Stokton, John Raa of Stokton, and others, entered the said liberty at Eston, without warrant, to make distrains and attachments there, broke his parks and houses there and at Wherleton and Grenehowe, entered his free chace and warrens there and at Eston, Semer, Hoton, Boynton and Aldewerk, hunted in these, carried away deer from the parks and chace, and hares, conies, pheasants and partridges from the warrens, trod down and consumed with cattle his crops, and besieged his men, servants and tenants at Eston in their houses for a long time, dragged them out of their houses and threatened them so that the men and servants have been compelled to withdraw from his service and the tenants from his tenure, whereby his land is left untilled and other business of his remains undone. July 20. Commission to Richard Ma . . . , John Stokton, John Dyk, John Westminster. Chaundeler, John Wilys and John de la Sauserye, reciting that, whereas the king understanding that Peter de Stapelton, clerk, had caused John de Moreton, Robert de Moreton and John Saundesson to be cited to answer in an alien court without the realm over their lay fee in Whitbern and there prosecuted a plea thereof, and had done and procured many other things to the prejudice of him and his crown, and of the said John, Robert and John, lately charged the sheriff of Northumberland, by writ, to warn the said Peter at Whitbern to be before the justices at Westminster a month after Easter to answer the king for his contempt and John, Robert and John, touching their damages, according to the ordinance and agreement in this case made by the common council of the realm, the said Peter did not appear at the day appointed and has been put out of the king's protection, and as the king understands is now evading justice in divers counties; and that the king has accordingly appointed them to arrest him and bring him at once before the said justices.

Aug. 2. Commission of oyer and terminer to Robert Bealknap, William de Westminster. Horne, Nicholas Heryng and William Tytecombe, on complaint by Thomas de Garwynton of Welle that John de Brokhull, 'chivaler,' William, his son, and others, at Heggardres, Elham and Bourne, co.
