- Nov. 18. Grant to the king's brother Thomas Beaufort and his heirs and assigns
Westminster. of the manors of Seintlyng in Seint Marycreye, co. Kent, Knell, co. Sussex, and Crokkeseston, co. Southampton, late of Robert Bealknap, 'chivaler,' and in the king's hands by virtue of a judgement against him in Parliament at Westminster, 11 Richard II, affirmed in this Parliament.
Vacated because elsewhere below. By p.s.
- Dec. 4. Commission by mainprise of William Bolle and Henry Walsham of the
Westminster. county of Lincoln to Michael del Logges, monk of the monastery of Seés in Normandy, of the custody of the alien priory of Wenghale from Michaelmas last during the war with France, rendering 10 marks yearly at the Exchequer, maintaining the houses and buildings, supporting all charges, paying tenths and other quota and finding the accustomed divine services.

- Nov. 24. Grant for life to the king's servant John Selby, the king's barber, of 20
Westminster. marks yearly from the farm and issues of the county of York. By p.s.
Vacated because in the third year.
- Mandate in pursuance to the sheriff.
- Nov. 15. Grant for life to Richard Kays, one of the king's serjeants at arms, for
Westminster. his good service to the king's father, deceased, and the king, that he shall be one of the king's serjeants at arms to the number of thirty, as limited in a statute in Parliament at Westminster, receiving 12*d.* daily for his wages at the Exchequer and a robe yearly at Christmas of the suit of the king's esquires at the hands of the keeper of the great wardrobe. - Nov. 20. *Inspeximus* and confirmation to Hugh Lyngeyn of letters patent dated
Westminster. 11 May, 22 Richard II, granting to him for life 20*l.* yearly.

- Nov. 8. Grant for life to William Hoghwyk, whom the king has retained for
Westminster. life, of 40*l.* yearly from the issues of the city of London. By p.s.
- Nov. 8. Grant for life to the king's servant William de Hoghwyk of the office
Westminster. of bailiff of the hundred of Gartre, co. Leicester, worth 12*l.* yearly, with the accustomed fees and other profits and commodities, as John Goderiche, deceased, had of the grant of Richard II. By p.s.
- Nov. 18. Grant to the king's brother Thomas Beaufort and his heirs and assigns
Westminster. of the manors of Seintlyng, Knell and Crokkeseston (*as above*). By p.s.
Vacated because in the second year.
- Oct. 30. *Inspeximus* and confirmation to the abbess and convent of Denneye of
Westminster. letters patent dated 10 May, 21 Richard II, granting to them two tuns of wine of Gascony yearly. By p.s. and for 10*s.* paid in the hanaper.
- Dec. 4. Whereas Edward III by letters patent granted to the abbot and con-
Westminster. vent of Stoneleye that they should not be compelled to grant any corrody or sustenance at the request of himself or his heirs, and nevertheless at his request and because they dared not resist his will one Henry Almayn was admitted to such sustenance as a monk had in the abbey; the king grants to them that during his life they shall not be charged with any further corrody or sustenance. - Oct. 24. *Inspeximus* and confirmation of letters patent dated 23 April,
Westminster. 22 Richard II, granting for life to William Leycestre 10*l.* yearly.
