Dear Bishop Jensen:

When Brother and Sister Price were having difficulty I called at the home a number of times, but was unable to get Mrs. Price to talk or even receive me into the home. What conversation I did have was through the screen door and that but briefly.

Mrs. Price started divorce proceedings because of cruelty which Mr. Price admits. A restraining order was <sup>also</sup> issued prohibiting him from visiting the home <sup>or</sup> staying there, or in any way molesting any of the children. However, before the case was brought to trial they began living together. Mr. Price contracted an obligation and built additional room for the family. I believe that \$300 worth of material was used. This he still owes, the debt being suspended during his service in the navy. He erred in not seeing that the divorce was set aside and because of the fact that it was not set aside he was classified in 1-A and called in the draft. There is no question in my mind but what he should not have been taken, as he was the only stabilizing influence in the home, if you can call his influence stabilizing. I had advised him to see that proper appeal and information was furnished to the draft board. It seems, however, that this he did not do. When I learned of his being in the draft I complained to the draft board and took the case up with her attorney who was very much surprised to know that Price had been called or that they had been living together contrary to court order.

A little while ago I received a letter from Brother Price which was the first information I had on his being in the service. He appealed to me to visit the home and give him any information as to the carryings on. I have hesitated to write to him for there is nothing favorable that I can write at all. When he was here, conditions were bad; but they are certainly worse now. I had investigated the case by going to the home but had been unable to find Mrs. Price there.

When I called last evening again after receiving your letter, I found her there with friends she introduced as her sister, her brother-in-law, and her brother. This was the first time I had ever been invited into the home. The reception was anything but warm. I was left standing and there was not much opportunity to talk to her. She left no question, however, in my mind that she has no desire to ever live with Price and will get rid of him at the first opportunity; and she is perfectly happy and satisfied in the money which she says she has not yet received, but which I doubted.

They live on the east bench with three or four reasonably close neighbors. Being scattered as they are, we do not see or come in contact with them very often. I have checked with the neighbors recently and they tell me that when he was home she was on 25th Street in the taverns with men at various hours, but that since he has been gone, 25th Street has moved up where she lives. She drinks openly in the yard, smokes, entertains men and soldiers at all hours; and one of the children has been investigated by various police officers for mischievous conduct. The neighbors are not sure that the man introduced as her brother is her brother. This is certainly not a satisfactory home for these children; yet, when at a loss to know just what to do. I know this condition

has been reported to the juvenile authorities, but they have been helpless to do anything and she has become insensed over it and is bitter toward those making the complaint.

It might be well if her father could come to Ogden and make a real investigation of the conditions which exist at this home, living there if possible. He certainly should be able to go into her home and talk to her and should insist upon her living a different kind of life. In inquiring from her the address of her husband and thus bringing up the question of writing and his correspondence, she told me that she has never written to him. She does not care to, but she did say that the chaplain had written to her telling her that she should communicate with her husband. She said she intended to write to him last night. I do not know how she could do it with the folks around in the dark, as they have no light other than candles. She has no water into the home, although we were successful a couple of years ago in having water piped to this location for the other neighbors who were then in distressed circumstances.

If her father could come down, it may be that he could persuade those staying at the home to do the labor to put the water into the house so that they wouldn't have to drink surface well water. I will be glad to use my influence in getting material for such a project. If her father comes to Ogden, I should certainly like to talk to him .

I will write to Brother Price and give him what information I feel may be adviseable. If you are able to suggest anything, I should be very glad to hear from you again.

OTHER INFORMATION—RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT OF MEMBERS OF FAMILY, OTHER SOURCES OF INCOME, DEBTS, PROBLEMS OF HEALTH OR CONDUCT, AND NEED FOR ASSISTANCE FROM CHURCH FUNDS:

1-23-42. Visited home at request of bishop. Mr. J. died the night before of a heart ailment and Mrs. J. says the family is unable to meet any of the burial expenses. He carried no life insurance, and the family has no savings and no relatives able to assist. The family's only income now is the allotment from Owen's CCC wages and the old age assistance received by Mrs. J.'s mother. The fuel supply on hand will last for another week and Mrs. J. says they have enough food to last a few days. The only immediate clothing needs are shoes or Janet and Shirley. Later consulted County Welfare Department and verified amount of the CCC allotment and Mrs. Brown's old age grant. The County is giving no other aid. Recommended to bishop that the County be asked to give burial assistance, but that the ward provide the burial clothing, and that the family be given aid with its living expenses to supplement the family income. Mrs. J. is in good health and willing to work two days a week at the regional welfare center. Her mother is able to assist with the housework and the supervision of the children while Mrs. J. is at the center.

1-24-42. Upon authorization of bishop arranged for County to assume all burial expenses except the burial clothing, which the ward will provide. Reported to County that ward will give whatever other assistance is necessary to supplement the family's income.

1-30-42. Visited family and gave Mrs. J. order on storehouse for food. She expects to be able to meet all other living expenses from the family income and also to buy enough milk. The children are well and in school, but the school nurse has recommended an eye examination for Janet. It was learned that the family had not been able to afford medical attention for Robert; with Mrs. J.'s consent his condition was reported to the Crippled Children's Service for examination and treatment. Suggested that Margaret apply for NYA student-aid employment to help with her school expenses.

2-6-42. Relief Society arranged for eye examination for Janet and purchased glasses prescribed by doctor.

**SUGGESTIONS FOR USE:**

A separate work sheet is to be used for each family. To compute family's food requirements for week, enter on the work sheet in the appropriate columns the number of individuals in the family. Enter in each column which applies to the particular family under consideration the amount of the weekly food allowance for the number of individuals designated at the head of these columns. The amount of the food allowance is to be determined by referring to the Food Distribution Guide and multiplying the amounts by the number of individuals shown at the top of corresponding columns on the work sheet. Do not enter quantities of those items of food which the family has on hand, or which it produces or earns through its own resources and industry (such as garden, cow, share acquired helping neighbor with crop, et cetera), in amounts equal to the specified quantities.

Column 11 (retail purchase price) need be filled in only with respect to those families who have some cash income to apply toward their food requirements after meeting all other living expenses. The retail purchase price entered should be the nearest approximate cost which the family would have

to pay at the store or other source where it ordinarily would purchase its food. In those instances where a family can purchase part of its food, the bishop should decide which items of food the family will purchase from its funds; the remaining food needed may then be provided by drawing on the bishop's storehouse. In such a situation, it is recommended that the family's income be applied first to those foods or household supplies which are not produced under the Church welfare program, and that storehouse orders be for those items which are produced on Church directed projects. (See monthly list of storehouse commodities for designation of items in stock which are produced on Church welfare projects and of those items which are purchased and carried in stock at bishops' storehouse.)

After computing the family's food requirements, this work sheet may be retained, filed in binder with Record of Family Under Care relating to same family and used as a guide for subsequent food orders so long as the number of individuals in the family and their respective age groups remain the same and so long as there is no change in the family's ability to provide its own food.

**ADDITIONAL ITEMS** (to be supplied according to need)—

Food flavorings, baking powder, yeast, et cetera, and personal and household items such as soap, toilet paper, et cetera, as shown to be available at the storehouse in the list of produced and purchased items issued monthly to bishops and Relief Society presidents.

**NOTE:** Only those items which are available at the bishops' storehouse are to be requisitioned on storehouse orders. The Bishops' Executive Council agrees on the complete stock of items to be carried in the storehouse and keeps ward bishops and Relief Society presidents informed as to this stock.

**SUGGESTIONS FOR USE**

The purpose of the Food Distribution Guide is first to establish accurate standards for estimating the food needs of a family and secondly to meet the need, insofar as possible, from foods produced under

the welfare plan. This distribution guide indicates weekly food allowances necessary, according to recognized nutrition standards, to supply protein, fuel, mineral salts and vitamins in sufficient quantity to maintain body growth and health. The food varieties listed have been adapted, insofar as possible, to the foods produced under the Church welfare plan.

The Food Distribution Guide can serve only as a general measure in estimating necessary food allowances, and should be applied according to the best judgment of the bishop and Relief Society president, taking into consideration the needs of different families, their particular make-up, occupations, and problems. Care should be exercised to avoid ordering any items in excess of the family's requirements for a given period so that there will be no temptation for individuals to sell commodities supplied to them. Wherever necessary, Relief Society presidents should arrange for giving some instruction to families with respect to the proper and economical use of food commodities with which they are supplied. In applying the Food Distribution Guide to individual families use Form RS 2—Work Sheet for Food Distribution to Individual Families.
