Came over to ^{Independence} ~~Hawthorn~~
and gained the
above information
at Independence mts
of mission headquarters 302 -
Pleasant St

B. F. Le Baron
and other Elders.
Took dinner, then
went down to
Editor B. F. Learnings
who took me up on the
Temple Block, went
through the ground

also went across
the Road north to
the Joseph Church, and
was taken through
it by Jerome G. Page
son of J. G. Page.

Then went west
to the Square where
Joseph was put on
Exhibition to the curiosity
public while under
an arrest.

Came back and took
Supper with Learnings.
Learnings and I
went up to the
Temple ground to a

meeting held there
by the Hendricksites
Presided over by
Bro Keli Haldeman
who read the 14th
Revelations for a Bro.
Garry Hill who
was the speaker of
the evening. When he
arose he said he
should like to speak of
the gathering a little
first.

Then he spoke of the
Saints who was com-
pelled to leave Independence
because of their

Transgressions, and
failure to live up to the
Law of Consolation,
he seemed to infer that
these were the Utah Mormons.

They took and prayed
for the time to speedily
come when their
person who was mighty
and strong would
come and build up
the Church and the
great City of the Lord.
Then they closed
their services, after which
I ask the people
to thank the people
for granting me

this privilege of being
with them hold
worship on this holy
Consecrated spot of ground

This they kindly
granted me. This I did
also thank them
because they did not
seem to have that
animosity against our
people that I was
expecting them to have
But they seemed to be
a very devoted set of
people to their God,
believing sincerely that
they were chosen to

go this back to this
promised land for to
hold the fort until
that great day would
come.

A good share of the
63 acres originally purchased
by the prophet as the
Holy Spot ground was
now owned by our
people. And President
Berrien was instructed
to pick up ground when
any was for sale.

Monday July 13

Came up town with
B F Jennings, to their
office.

Part of the day looking
up the prices of buildings
and ground.

The afternoon I
went and saw Bro.

Hutchison from
old Tennessee. His wife
was one of the Totty girls
She told me about
Jack and Roy Totty
and where they
lived here in town

Jack Totty lives at
217 in the rear of
Main Hardware
store. He had gone
to Tennessee to see
old friends.

His wife was the
daughter of J. H. Scott
She was glad to
see me.

I then went to Roy
Totty plant 213 N
Walker street.

and met there good
old friends, and stayed
all night with them

Tuesday July 14/908

I Parted with Bro. Lacey; who seemed very glad to see me although he and his brother had joined the Josephites.

They said they wished they had went to Utah instead of Colorado, then they would have been all right.

Took Mr. Beardsmore down to Sister Jack Folly and returned them

and Sherman told him to come again.

Subsequent

Cornel Pletcher and Governor Boys of Missouri in 1833 drove the Saints from Independence north to Clay County across the Mo. River

Andrew Jackson was President of the U.S. at this time over 1000 people were driven out of Jackson County.

150 horses were
consumed by fire
James Campbell
who went to cross the
mo. River said the
Cross would put
his body if did not
kill J. Smith. He
drowned & the bird ate body.

Sat down on corner

Mrs. S. G. Kerr is a daughter

a picture of the
Simple Lot send to
the Independent Office
to have reproduced

John Whitmore had
in Far West a hold on
his place, about 80 Rod
East of the Temple lot
The Malmsley Hotel
was just across the
Road South.

Joseph Smith house was
one block South and one
west.

Whitmore wanted
\$3000⁰⁰ for Temple lot about
2 acres. The other 80
acres a beautiful place
he said 6000⁰⁰ had 9000⁰⁰

The Temple Light is
on a high elevated
spot as there is 15 miles
around. In fact you
can see in every direction
Shoal Creek penetrates
this place like a
horse shoe on the north
South and East sides

These three Counties
lay, Clinton Caldwell
and Davern, does not
have so much timber or
them as the Southern
Part of the State.

The 14th we went to
Liberty in order to see the
jail, that Joseph was in.
However it had been
torn down. And a
house built on the same
place, by a widow
Stevens.

Dr. Allen said
the jail was built in
1829 - about 25 x 25 one
room below for jail
Rock floor Hingham
logs for upper floor,
the basement was
partly underground

The door to the upper floor
was about 3 x 7 of black
oak, and some small
knives.

The old jailer
James H. Ford was
now dead.

They had an old fash-
ioned stocks to put the
head in and arms
so they could be whipped
as punishment.

The dungeon had two
small windows well
ironed.

Bymons whills old
house still stands
there, very much

depleted, the house
is part way up the hill
on the South west
Point of Ltras Aultor
ground. Following up
this point just on
the top is the Aultor
There is seemingly an
excavation made by
some one, on a soft
lime rock formation
on the south west
side is a Hackberry
tree about $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet
in diameter on the
South west side there
is a walnut

about 12" diameter,
on the front and
east following up the
ridge is a bed of
Pickley Pairs.

Rushing through this
Valley of Adan Ondram,
directly on the South
is the Grande River,
bearing a little South
of East. The Valley is
about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile wide
This valley is very
smooth and level
Covered at this time
with waving fields of
corn, and some
Hard wood trees

The whole author and
Ridge is covered with
Hardwood trees, which
would average 12 to 18"
diameter.

There is a hollow
coming down from the
north east into the
Valley, that separates
the Faulter Point and
the Ridge on which
the City of Diamond
was built.

This City was
erected by the
Saturday Saints in
1837-8.

At this time this
was the largest
settlement in Davis
County.

We went up on this
Ridge and gathered
up a few pieces of
brick the ruins of
the fort.

Top of this Ridge
is about 200 feet
above the valley.

When the Saints
was driven out in 1839
these houses were all
burned down by the
enemies of the Lords
people.

I indeed this is a
beautiful place.

We then returned to
the City of Gallatin
the attorney Button
would not take any pay
so I gave his little son
\$200

This Gudlunn and

very kind to us and
invited us return
We then took the
train on and
came to Buncy
Ill.
