to learn the art, trade mystery or occupation of a wheelwright and waggon maker by the
said William C. Moore now with and with him as an apprentice to dwell continue and serve
from the Day of the date of these presents unto the full end and term of nine years and
two hundred and forty four Days from thence next ensuing and fully to be complete as
and ended during all which term of nine years two hundred and forty four Days. The said

Commands readily obey him to his said master he shall not do nor wilfully suffer it to be
done by others. the goods of his master he shall not embezzel or waste nor lend them without
his consent to any at cards dice or any other unlawful game he shall not play taverns or

and he shall as a good and faithful Apprentice shall and will demean and behave himself

he will treat the said Apprentice kindly and also the said master shall and will during the
aforesaid term ^{the} said Apprentice to some good english school a sufficient time to acquire
of reading writing spelling and arithmetick as far as the trade of trade likewise that he
shall and will set the expiration of the said term of time of nine years and two hundred and
fifteen and give to the said Apprentice one good suit of serving Day and one suit of holiday
of tools suitable and sufficient to work at the said trade and fifty pounds current
