Dear Brother:

President Thomas B. Evans, has recommended, at the request of President Anthon H. Lund, your name as representative of the Genealogical Society of Utah in Ogden Stake. It is desired that you labor under the direction of the Committee on Increase of Membership. We have written to President Evans that his recommendation meets with the approval of the officers of our Society and that you have been appointed to this important work. We mail you a package of circulars, which may be used freely amongst the members, the blanks being filled in for life or annual membership as may be desired.
