9 me president, It was 49 years since she became
10 acquainted with Sister Belnap in the Relief society, thought
11 it was the grandest organisation in existence let us not
12 blight the feelings of a life time of friendship by a

Sept 24th 1907 - Special meeting of the Relief Society of Hooper Ward was held at the ward meeting house at 10 o'clock P.M. Bishop William Child presiding, there were present the ward Bishopric also Relief Society Stake President Jane S. Richards Counselor Emily Shurtliff Stake Secretary Nellie Burrapt

Opened with singing "Do what is right" etc. Prayer by Oscar S. Rice of the Bishopric Singing Redeemer of Israel etc Minutes of Sept 17 read and approved

After which it was proposed that President Adeline Kelnap be released also for Counselors Margaret Manning and Jennet Child, it was unannouncedly carried and they were honorably released.

Ellen Johnson was then unanimously sustained as President of the Hooper Relief Society with Jennet Child as 1st and Lounda Parker as 2nd counselors Elizabeth Manning Secretary Josephine Manning assistant and Subina Kelnap Treasurer. Christa Bess president of teachers names of teachers read and sustained

President Jane S. Richards spoke kindly of the retiring officers, they were old in years as well as in Relief society work commended the sisters to

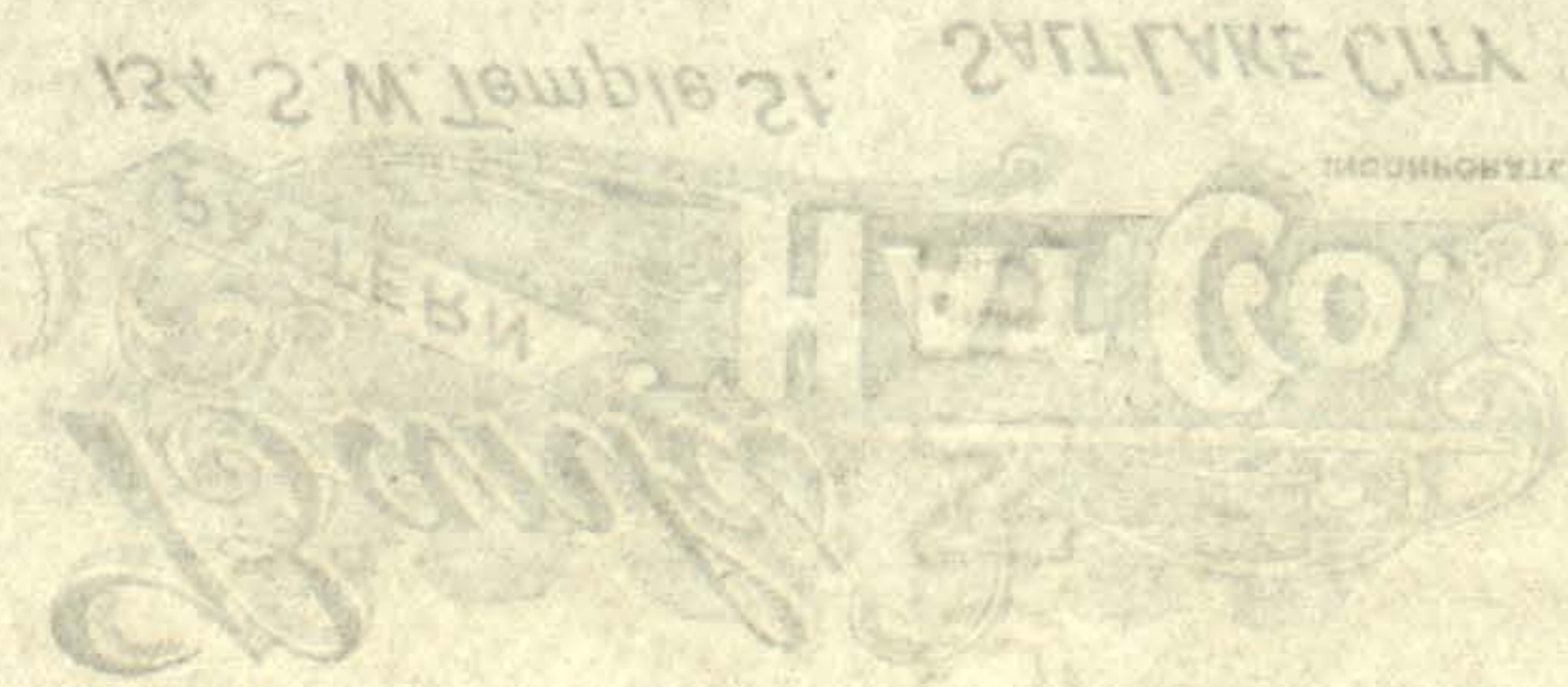
