Insurance Agents would not give an insurance on goods and buildings in the neighbourhood referred to for less than ten percent. The petitioners asked the Council to condemn the use of stove pipes for chimneys, and enforce strict regulations for the disposition of coal and wood ashes.

After investigating the matter, the Ordinance in force relating thereto, and the duties of the Inspector of Buildings Councilor Penrose offered the following Resolution, which was adopted:-

X "Resolved that the Inspector of Buildings be, and <sup>is</sup> hereby required to inspect all places in the vicinity of Fourth, Main and Fifth Streets, from which there appears to be immediate cause of danger from fire, and require the said cause of danger to be immediately abated, according to the provisions of section seven of "An Ordinance relating to the Prevention of Fires", passed September 19<sup>th</sup>, A. D., 1870."
