

OGDEN CITY COUNCIL HALL, Regular Meeting, Sep. 16th, 1887.

The City Council met Sep. 16th, 1887, at half past five o'clock P.M., as per adjournment, Mayor Eccles presiding.

Roll called. Quorum present. Opening prayer by Rev. Sminis.

Minutes of meetings held Aug. 25th, Sep. 2nd, and Sep. 15th, 1887, were read and approved.

Petitions

W. Belnap ✓ Hyrum Belnap, in behalf of the Fourth Ward Sunday School, asked the Council to grant to said school the use of the Pavilion on Lester Park on the 21st inst.

On motion of Ald. Wright the petition was granted on the usual conditions.

Newton Farr ✓ Newton Farr, asked the Council to grant to the Third Ward Sunday school the use of the Pavilion on Lester Park, on the 23rd inst.

On motion of Councilor Clark the petition was granted.

Hook & Laddler ✓ The Hook & Laddler Co. asked the privilege of using the Pavilion on the 22nd or 27th of Sep. 1887, for the purpose of giving a dance.

The petition was granted.

A. D. Chambers ✓ Anna D. Chambers, asked the Council to remit his City Tax for the present year, amounting to \$5.⁰⁰, on the ground that he had been afflicted with rheumatism for the past twelve months, and unable to perform any manual labor.

On motion of Ald. West the tax was remitted.

J. E. Coolidge ✓ J. E. Coolidge asked permission to convey into the Fourth Street Drain, by means of a two inch iron pipe, the waste water from his steam laundry, on Fourth St., between Main and Peunoy Sts.

On motion of Ald. Dee the petition was granted, during the pleasure of the Council, and under the supervision of the Sup't of Water Works.

John Watson ✓ and 28 others ✓ John Watson and 28 others represented that Pearl St., between Fourth and Seventh St., is in a very bad condition, and almost impassable during the winter months, and wet weather; that a small expense would be sufficient to grade the streets between the points mentioned. They asked the Council to take steps as soon as possible to put the street in good repair.

On motion of Councilor Bayle the matter was referred to the Comm. on Streets, with power to act.
