(3) an inquisition post mortem upon her death taken at Tamworth before William Trussell, escheator this side Trent, on 18 January, 13 Edward III., in which the jury find *inter alia* that at her death the eastle reverts to Baldwin and his heirs in virtue of the aforesaid fine, that it is of no yearly value beyond reprisals, and that the said Baldwin, her heir, was at Michaelmas aged forty years and upwards.
