ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

Section 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in the Society who, being of the age of twenty-one years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the lineal descendant of an ancestor who was at all times faithful in his loyalty to, and rendered active service in, the cause of American Independence...

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant derives eligibility by descent from more than one ancestor, and it is desired to take advantage thereof, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Application," should be made in each case and filed with the original.

State fully such documentary or traditional authority as you found the following record upon, and also the residence of ancestors, with dates of birth and death, if known.

By order of the Board of Trustees, May 3, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership fee, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or total disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

Jesse Belnap was born Aug 31, 1760 - died Oct 11, 1854. He resided at Nelson, Connecticut Aug 6, 1777. He was discharged at New York in Aug 1780. He served as a private in Capt. Halsey and Capt. Belnap's companies. He received a pension of \$144 per year beginning March 1831 which was increased to \$240 per year in 1851. His pension certificate and affidavit are on file at the Pension Office Washington D.C. Pension granted Jan 29, 1833. Jesse Belnap had fourteen children. He is buried in the Phillippe Cemetery two miles East of North East Village, Erie County, Pa. The Phillippes came to North East Township, Erie County, Pa. in Feb. 1815. The Belnaps came to the same place in 1814. Both families coming from Sagoyga Lake, New York. One of Jesse Belnap's fourteen children, Eunice Belnap, married Burt Phillippe in 1804. Record of the date of arrival of the Phillippes and the Belnaps at North East Village Pa. with record of the families of Belnap, Phillippe and Johnson can be found in the published records of the Pennsylvania Historical Society about...

4th Child of Paul Phillips and Esquire (Delap) Phillips  
married in Sept. 1837. Wally Maria Esquire daughter  
of Elias Esquire and Sarah Esquire. The Esquires, the  
Phillips and most of the Phillips are buried in  
the Phillips cemetery on a part of Paul Phillips farm two  
miles East of North East, Erie Co. Penn. *Miriam*  
Phillips married in 1850 to *Robert Kellogg* (with his  
name on North Indiana) My Father, who was born  
in North East, Pa. went to Iowa Kellogg with them  
and from there he went to Chicago and settled  
in Co. C. 65th Ill. June 9, 1862. King 14. 7. 7. no  
and 9. 2. 0. 0. and served until he was seriously  
wounded at James General Hospital Baltimore Md. June  
8, 1863. He was in all the battles of the Atlanta  
campaigns, May 1. Sept. 1, 1864. Battle of Franklin & Battle of  
Nashville, Tennessee. He was wounded at Tower  
Creek, Va. Feb. 20, 1865. *Esquire Phillips*  
Ohio, May 1, 1878 and was appointed to meet Penn. by Congressman  
C. H. Beach, 20th Cong. dist. Ohio, September 11, 1903.
